Jr./Sr. High Option classes

Sewing 🤰

Students will learn basic and advanced sewing techniques, including hand stitching, machine sewing, and pattern reading. They will complete projects such as hand embroidery, pillows, tote bags, stuffed animals or simple clothing items. This class helps develop fine motor skills, patience, and creativity.

Foods Q

In this course, students will explore essential cooking skills, kitchen safety, and nutrition. They will prepare a variety of dishes, from simple snacks to full meals, while learning about food science and meal planning. This hands-on class is perfect for fostering independence and healthy eating habits.

Music 🞜

Students will have the opportunity to explore music through instruments, singing, or digital music production. They will develop their understanding of rhythm, melody, and harmony while building confidence in performance and creativity.

STEM/Robotics 🗑

In Jr. STEM students explore various disciplines including CAD (Computer Aided Design), 3D printing, coding and robotics. In the first half of the course students are introduced to CAD software through Tinkercad. This allows them to create their own 3D designs and projects. Some projects that students completed this year include: custom rings, keychains, bookmarks, and many others. These projects are then 3D printed and students can take them home. The second half of the course students begin exploring coding through a device called a Micro Bit. This helps prepare them for a quick introduction to educational robotics at the end of the course.


In Sr. STEM students explore concepts in technology and design through Alberta's CTS framework. They choose from three specialized pathways:

- Electro-Technologies (ELT): Students explore soldering, circuit boards, components and robotics.
- Design (DES): Students develop creative problem-solving skills through graphic design,
 2D and 3D design, CAD software, and 3D printing..
- Computing Science (CSE): Students build programming skills, algorithms, and computational thinking for real-world applications.

Outdoor Education

Students explore the historical aspects of wildlife in Alberta and Canada, examining the impact of human activities on wildlife populations and their significance in society. They analyze the evolving relationships between humans and the natural world while developing the attitudes, skills, and knowledge necessary for responsible participation in a variety of outdoor activities and survival situations.

Students have the opportunity to choose from 25+ different options in a variety of subject areas. We have courses on Financial Management, Law, Psychology, Word Processing, Keyboarding, Nutrition & Wellness, Health Services, Photography, Aboriginal Studies, and Forestry. Students are also able to obtain their safety tickets needed to work in the trades such as H2S, Confined Spaces, Ladder Safety, and Electrical Safety

STUDENT SUPPORT TEAM

Did you know that Vilna School offers a number of in-school supports for students?

School Counselor: A school counselor plays a crucial role in supporting the academic, social, emotional, and career development of students. Their responsibilities vary, but generally include the following: Academic Support: Identifying and addressing academic challenges, such as learning disabilities or behavioral issues. Collaborating with teachers and parents to create academic intervention plans. Social and Emotional Support: Offering support during difficult times, such as family problems, peer conflict, or emotional struggles. Counselors are also able to help work on building self-esteem, self-confidence, boundary setting, and goal setting. Crisis Intervention: Responding to immediate crises, such as accidents, violence, or other emergencies affecting the school community. Advocacy: Advocating for students' needs and rights within the school system. Collaboration with Stakeholders: Working closely with teachers, administrators, and parents to support students holistically. Collaborating with community resources, such as mental health agencies, to provide additional support. Overall, the role of a school counselor is multifaceted and aims to create a positive and inclusive school.

Family School Liaison: The Family School Liaison Program is a free-of-charge, client-based, goal-focused program provided through local municipalities. This program is also supported by Aspen View Public Schools and Alberta Health Services - Mental Health. The program is designed to meet the social and emotional needs of children and youth who are experiencing difficulties. It provides support, encouragement and ideas in a non-judgmental, confidential manner.

Indigenous School Liaison: typically serves a similar role to a family school liaison, but with a focus on supporting Indigenous students and their families, addressing the specific cultural, social, and emotional needs that Indigenous communities may experience.

Success Coach: Our Success coach can answer questions regarding high school planning, courses or graduation requirements.
